



ACTING DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Diwali is one of the most beautiful Hindu festivals, often referred to as the 'Festival of the Lights'. This festival was celebrated recently, and symbolically represents 'the spiritual victory of light over darkness, good over evil and knowledge over ignorance.'

Hanukkah will soon be celebrated within the Jewish faith, beginning December 7th. Hanukkah, which is Hebrew for "dedication," is also known as the Festival of Lights. It commemorates the victory of the Maccabees over the Syrian Greek

army, and the subsequent miracle of rededicating the Holy Temple in Jerusalem and restoring its menorah, or lamp. The miracle of Hanukkah is that only one vial of oil was found with just enough oil to illuminate the Temple lamp for one day, and yet it lasted for eight full days. The beautiful menorah is lit in Jewish homes each of the eight nights for the duration of the festival.

Similarly, in Christianity, we too acknowledge in many rites and rituals the significance of the symbol of light. Indeed, our students are currently learning about the Season of Advent, which begins on Sunday 3 December. One key symbol of Advent is the Advent Candles and Advent Wreath. Each candle represents a theme for each of the four weeks that Advent goes for. The themes are Hope, Peace, Joy and Love.

Remembrance Day

Our focus during today's Assembly, was to acknowledge and pay our respects for Remembrance Day. This has also been the focus within prayer in Homeroom this week. The students were able to pray for those courageous men, women and children who have died in conflict, as well as to pray for peace and love in our world. They listened to stories that were shared, and songs that were meaningful. They became familiar with important symbols, such as the red poppy. These occasions are special within the culture of our society, and our world, and engaging our students in these moments helps them learn of their importance.

Semester 2 Reports

Reports for each student in years 7-11 will be published on Sentral Parent Portal on Friday 8th December at 5pm. These reports give an overview of your child's learning and progress this semester.

Reports give parents a wholistic view of their child's development at the College in the curriculum areas, as well as in social and transition skills. You will find that your child's homeroom teacher has made a comment on their overall progress through Semester 1 as well as their assessment of certain social and transition skills. Subject teachers will report on a selection of tasks that students have



completed, by no means a complete list, but one intended to give you an overview of classroom activities. Subject teachers also report on the overall achievement of a student in the class.

I encourage you to read these reports with your children, and help them reflect on the progress and achievements they have made in Semester 2.
